Helping to stop the deportation of Pakistani gay man

Pakistani gay couple Talhia and Zain need our help. The couple married in Australia earlier this year. When Talhia's family heard that he had married a man, they disowned him and warned that relatives would kill him if he returned to Pakistan.

The Pakistani penal code imposes a life sentence for homosexuality. Since 1997, when Islamic reforms were instituted, punishment can also include up to 100 lashes and stoning to death.

The application fee for permanent residency is \$7000. This is an impossible sum for the couple. They have reached out to 78ers and we are right behind them - as 78ers we know what persecution feels like.

So far, over half of the cost of the application has been raised. If you can donate even a small amount this will get Tahlia and Zain closer to their target. Tahlia and Zain's situation is genuine and urgent. Donations can be made at:
